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DETAILED ACTION

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The present application is being examined under the pre-AIA first to invent provisions.

1. Amendment and response filed by applicants dated April 4, 2015 have been entered and considered carefully.

Claims 1-108, 119, 122-123 have been canceled.

Claims 109-118, 120-121 are pending.

2. Reason for Allowance

The following is an examiner's statement of reasons for allowance:

Applicants have limited the scope of mixture of 80% by weight of one polymorphic form of un-solvated crystalline 3-4(amino- l-oxo- l,3-dihydro-isoindol-2-yl)-piperidine-2,6-dione and less than about 20% by weight of amorphous form which finds antecedent basis on p.6. It is recognized that substantially 80% pure un-solvated crystalline 3-4(amino- l-oxo- l,3-dihydro-isoindol-2-yl)-piperidine-2,6-dione is a quantitative measurement of a solid mixture (see Berstein p.117 of record), i.e. 80/20 mixture. Such quantitative relationship can be measure by DSC of mixture such as disclosed in figure 46. The quantitative assessment of amounts for different forms in a mixture using DSC is a routine practice at the time the invention was made (see McGregor et al. p.236, fig. 7). Therefore, the 112 first paragraph rejections are dropped. Claims 109-118, 120-121 are allowed.
